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## Foreword to the 1995 Edition

*A Survey of Sources at the Rockefeller Archive Center for the History of Child Studies* was compiled in the spring of 1988 by archivist Melissa A. Smith in conjunction with a Rockefeller Archive Center conference, "Children at Risk in America." The survey has been one of the most popular of the Center's cross-collection subject surveys, and we are pleased to make available this revised edition, which has been redesigned and reformatted by Pecolia Rieder. Rockefeller Papers, 1879-1894, and from the Personal Giving series of the Russell Sage Foundation Records, which documents the private philanthropy of Mrs. Russell Sage, 1879-1919. We are grateful to Mr. Graham and Ms. Rieder for their work on this edition, and to Ms. Smith for her considerable efforts in compiling the original survey.

# Introduction

The term “child studies” encompass many areas of research, as demonstrated by this survey. The unifying theme of the survey is the well-being of children in home, legal and institutional settings. Listed here is material in Rockefeller Archive Center collections documenting the history of providing for the rearing, protection and socialization of children in the United States over the past 100 years. The topics covered by this survey include but are not limited to: adoption and the care of orphans, child development, child health and hygiene, day care, family relations, family welfare and services, juvenile delinquency, parent education, recreation and social clubs, rural youth, and youth unemployment.

The topic of medicine has been excluded unless it relates to children in a broad context, such as mental health and hygiene or maternal health. The same is true of education. While not included in its narrow interpretation, wider aspects of education, such as school lunch programs and arts in education, will be found. Files on organizations that dealt with children as one of many program aspects are not included unless the files specifically concern children. For the purposes of this survey, childhood ranges from infancy through adolescence.

The survey is arranged by collection. Within each collection the folder title and, when available, a brief description of folder contents is given. Box and folder numbers are also provided. The dates encompassed by this survey are 1888-1982. Any restrictions are explained in the note describing each collection.

## Notes on Photograph Collections

The Rockefeller Archive Center holds a photograph collection of more than 200,000 images, including prints (both black and white and color), negatives, slides and albums. Arranged by the same titles as the document collections, the photographs both complement the written records and stand alone as a rich historical resource. Among the topics documented are public health demonstrations, infant care, personal hygiene, and milk campaigns, as well as elementary and secondary education for both blacks and whites. ## **BUREAU OF SOCIAL HYGIENE ARCHIVES, 1911-1940**

Incorporated in 1913 for “the study, amelioration, and prevention of those social conditions, crimes, and diseases which adversely affect the well being of society,” the Bureau was the result of John D. Rockefeller, Jr.’s appointment to a Special Grand Jury to investigate white slavery in New York City in 1910. The Bureau’s emphasis initially was on fighting prostitution, vice, narcotics, and police corruption. After 1928, the Bureau developed a broader interest in criminology, crime reporting, and juvenile delinquency. The material concerning this last topic is listed here. The Bureau was dissolved in 1940.

## COMMONWEALTH FUND ARCHIVES, 1918-1982

The Commonwealth Fund was established in 1918 by Mrs. Stephen V. Harkness for “benevolent, religious, educational and like purposes.” Most of the Fund’s grants have been in the broad fields of health and medicine.

Grants were initially made with no overall theme. An emphasis on child welfare soon developed, however, beginning with a \$750,000 war relief appropriation to the European Children’s Fund. This emphasis continued with several planned programs, including the Program for the Prevention of Delinquency, created in 1921, and the establishment of a series of child health demonstrations in rural areas.

When it later became evident that the well-being of children could not be isolated from that of society at large, the Fund broadened its programs to deal with public health and community health services in general. By the late 1940s, as public health became securely established as a professional activity, the Fund’s focus moved toward medical education. Aside from an international fellowship program, most of the Commonwealth Fund’s appropriations today go toward medical education and fellowship awards in the health fields.

## THE DAVISON FUND, INC. RECORDS, 1930-1942

John D. Rockefeller, Jr. established the Davison Fund in 1930 to systemize his personal giving. With no limitation as to beneficiaries or fields, the dominant concerns of the Fund became child welfare, medicine and health, distress relief, and the improvement of social conditions. The Fund took a special interest in New York City and its environs.

Lawrence B. Dunham was associated with the Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial between 1925 and 1928, directing studies of crime and juvenile delinquency. For the next six years, 1928-1934, he was director of the Bureau of Social Hygiene, where he developed programs that reflected his interests while involved with the LSRM. On April 16, 1935, he was appointed to the Domestic Relations Court of New York City. He retired from the bench after World War II.

## GENERAL EDUCATION BOARD ARCHIVES, 1902-1964

John D. Rockefeller established the General Education Board in 1903 to assist education in the United States “without distinction of race, sex or creed.” While an emphasis was placed on African-American education and the South, the GEB supported and encouraged all aspects of education in the public schools and in colleges and universities. Support in the various areas of child study was a natural result of the GEB’s work.

Grants were made for endowment and general budgetary support of colleges and universities, to support state school systems, for fellowships and scholarships, and for special programs. It also assisted the development of social and economic resources as a route to improved education systems. The GEB’s last appropriation was made in 1964.

## **THE JDR 3RD FUND ARCHIVES, 1956-(1963-1979)**

The JDR 3rd Fund was founded in 1963 by John D. Rockefeller 3rd. The Fund enacted its broad mandate “to stimulate, encourage, promote, and support activities important to human welfare” through three major programs. These were the Arts in Education Program, the Asian Cultural Program, and the Task Force on Youth.

The Arts in Education Program was established in 1967 to integrate the arts into all grades in the educational system. The program operated on three levels. Pilot programs designed as models were established in receptive school systems. Curriculum tools were designed to include the arts in all phases of classroom learning, mostly through the research of CEMREL (Central Midwestern Educational Laboratory). Financial support and leadership were provided for consortia to pool ideas and talents. These activities continued until July 1979.

The Youth Task Force was created in 1970 to encourage collaboration between youth and leaders in politics and business. The Fund sponsored a series of dialogues between the two groups. It also provided technical assistance for social service programs in which they could work together. The Task Force also sponsored a series of surveys of youth attitudes, changing trends and values, conducted by Daniel Yankelovich, Inc. These surveys resulted in a number of publications. The Task Force was disbanded in 1974 while the JDR 3rd Fund continued until 1979.

The Youth Task Force records comprise three of the twelve series of the JDR 3rd Fund collection while the Arts in Education make up two series. Following is a description of each of these five series. Consult the register for a folder listing of the collection.

## MARK M. JONES PAPERS, 1890-(1916-1965)

Mark M. Jones (1890-1986) became involved in studies of various economic interests of John D. Rockefeller, Jr. while Director of Economic Staff of the industrial relations firm Curtis, Fosdick and Belknap. He continued to do occasional work for the Rockefellers after going into private practice as a consulting economist in 1926.

His papers consist primarily of studies and reports that relate to various companies and nonprofit organizations. Specific types of reports include economic audits, surveys, reorganization proposals, analysis of policy and finances, and development plans.

## THE ROCKEFELLER UNIVERSITY ARCHIVES, 1901-1989

The Rockefeller University was established in 1901 as The Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research. It was the first institute in the U.S. devoted solely to biomedical research.

There are scattered records concerning children in the Rockefeller University collection. They document a health center for children, children's gardens on the Institute's grounds, and the university's Children's School. ## RUSSELL SAGE FOUNDATION RECORDS, 1888-(1907-1982)

The Russell Sage Foundation was established in 1907 by Olivia Slocum Sage for “the improvement of social and living conditions in the United States of America.” Between 1907 and 1946 the Foundation conducted investigations and field studies into social concerns including housing, labor and industrial relations, public health, and the professionalization of social work. The Foundation also had an active publication program based on its field work and supported social agencies involved in work similar to its own.

In 1948 RSF underwent a philosophical and structural reorganization. It shifted its focus to research in the broader fields of the social and behavioral sciences and the strengthening of social welfare methodology.

**SPELMAN FUND OF NEW YORK ARCHIVES, 1928-1950**

The Spelman Fund was created in 1928 with a grant from the Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial, which was being merged with The Rockefeller Foundation. The main programs of the Fund were in public administration and intergovernmental relations. However, it did continue to support, for the duration of individual grants, those broad programs begun by the Memorial in child study and interracial relations. The Fund was dissolved in 1949.
