This survey of sources lists material specifically relating to labor and industrial relations at the Rockefeller Archive Center. This includes the study of and active participation in labor and industrial relations by the organizations and people whose material is located at the Center. The survey has not been limited to American documents.

Topics which have been included are:

- economic security (social security)
- wages
- income tax
- unemployment
- employment
- occupational choices
- leisure time
- labor law
- unions
- industrial health
- profit-sharing
- specific vocational education

Records relating to the internal operations of the organizations surveyed have not been included unless the files were considered to be broad in impact on labor and industrial relations. "Industrial" schools have not been automatically listed.

Related fields which have not been listed but may include material on labor and industrial relations are business and economics.

Within these limits, this survey may be regarded as complete.

The Commonwealth Fund was established in 1918 with an endowment of \$10 million from Mrs. Stephen V. Harkness for "benevolent, religious, educational and like purposes." Grants supported child welfare, public health, rural hospitals, medical research and medical education. The material has been processed and a register is available.

GENERAL EDUCATION BOARD RECORDS, (1901-1964)-1967

The General Education Board (GEB) was established in 1903 by John D. Rockefeller to aid education in the U.S. "without distinction of race, sex or creed." The program included grants for endowment and budgetary support of colleges and universities and fellowship and scholarship assistance to state school systems at all levels. The collection has been processed and a register is available.

Series 1 Appropriations, Subseries 1, Early Southern Program

This subseries reflects the original interest of the GEB in the development of a comprehensive system of education in the U.S., which entailed grants to schools, colleges and universities for building and endowment, and teacher training, certification and salaries. Thus, the files reflect upon working conditions for teachers. Materials for particular schools, especially the industrial and agricultural schools, also contain discussion of vocational education, including home economics, and regional employment opportunities in agriculture and industry.

The list below includes all of the schools, colleges, and universities which received GEB support under this program. This series is arranged alphabetically by state and, within each state, by numerical code. Not all numbers are used in each state.

ROCKEFELLER UNIVERSITY ARCHIVES, 1840-(1901-1989)

Access to the material is through proper name. Many of the indexes indicate a topic closely related to labor and industrial relations, such as business or industry. The material has been processed and a register is available.

RECORD GROUP 2. OFFICE OF THE MESSRS. ROCKEFELLER, 1890-1961. The General Files of the Office of the Messrs. Rockefeller, 1890-1961, were assembled in the family offices in New York City at 26 Broadway and at Room 5600, 30 Rockefeller Plaza.

Under the guidance of John D. Rockefeller, Jr. (JDR Jr.) and a small number of close associates, the office supervised a number of diversified philanthropies. During his lifetime, JDR Jr. gave over \$550,000,000 to educational, religious, cultural, welfare, medical and other charitable projects.

NELSON A. ROCKEFELLER Papers, 1930-1979. The papers of Nelson A. Rockefeller (1908-1979) constitute three record groups within the Rockefeller Family Archives: Record Group 4, Nelson A. Rockefeller, Personal; Record Group 15, Nelson A. Rockefeller, Gubernatorial, and Record Group 26, Nelson A. Rockefeller, Vice Presidential. These records document labor issues at facilities with which Rockefeller was involved — specifically, the Museum of Modern Art and Rockefeller Center — and labor as both a political and public policy issue, as well as the role of organized labor in the electoral process.

In addition to the specific files listed below, researchers may wish to consult the Gubernatorial Office Records, which are on microfilm (862 reels) at the Archive Center. “Labor” is one of the major subject headings within these records; the subject files are arranged alphabetically within Rockefeller’s terms of office as governor of the State of New York (1959-1962; 1963-1966; 1967-1970; and 1971-1973). With some imagination and thinking in terms of categories and subheadings, researchers can locate material on specific labor issues. For example, under the heading “Public Utilities” one will find material on “Transportation,” which includes a section on “Railroads,” which includes material on the “Full Crew Law.” One can envision this arrangement as follows:

Public Utilities
 Transportation
 Railroads
 Full Crew Law

The gubernatorial speech index includes subject headings such as “Labor,” “Labor Disputes,” and “Civil Service.” This index will guide the researcher to speeches, press releases, and transcripts of Rockefeller’s remarks at appearances and press conferences in two series within Record Group 15: Series 25, Press Office and Series 33, Speeches.

Rockefeller’s Vice Presidential papers (Record Group 26) contain no speeches or press releases specifically on labor, but there are a few files of constituent mail on labor in Series 3, Central Files, which contain general correspondence.
